

DoIT 2010 Proposed Operating Budget

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DoIT's Mission

- The mission of the Department is to design, build, procure, implement, integrate and support Information Systems and Technology that help all Westchester County departments and stakeholder agencies operate more effectively and efficiently, and to make information more accessible.
- In turn, DoIT helps achieve the three main County-wide goals:
 - improving public safety
 - improving health/environment
 - promoting fiscal management (reduced costs/increased revenue)

Budget Summary

- DoIT's 2009 proposed Budget totals \$ 42,705,046 in expenses and \$ 48,845,874 in revenues.
- Compared to 2009, revenues decreased \$ 3,138,983 with a concomitant decrease of \$2,288,367 for expenses.
- Headcount reduced by 2 positions
- IT Operating Budget is comprised of three distinct areas
 - Core IT
 - Traditional Information Technology expenses, prior to 2008 was known as IT Operating Budget
 - E-911
 - Institutionalized into IT Operating Budget in 2008
 - Wireless
 - Institutionalized into IT Operating Budget in 2008

Proposed Budget Changes

- Annual Salaries decreases by \$ 234,966
 - Due to staggered hiring , two abolished positions and the furlough.
- Other Professional Services increases by \$27,253
 - Due primarily to fringe benefits.
- Equipment increases by \$131,642
- Materials and Supplies decreases by \$70,277
- Equipment Service and Rental decreases by \$261,401
 - Due to the elimination of some maintenance contracts
- Communications increases by \$ 459,837
 - Due almost entirely to E-911 charges
- Technical Services decreases by \$ 422,302
 - Due to continued effort to reduce the use of consultants

Proposed Budget Changes

- Debt Service Principal decreases \$1,659,421
 - Due to the final payment of \$1.2 million for BIT05 in 2009
 - The difference of \$460,000 is broken out as follows:

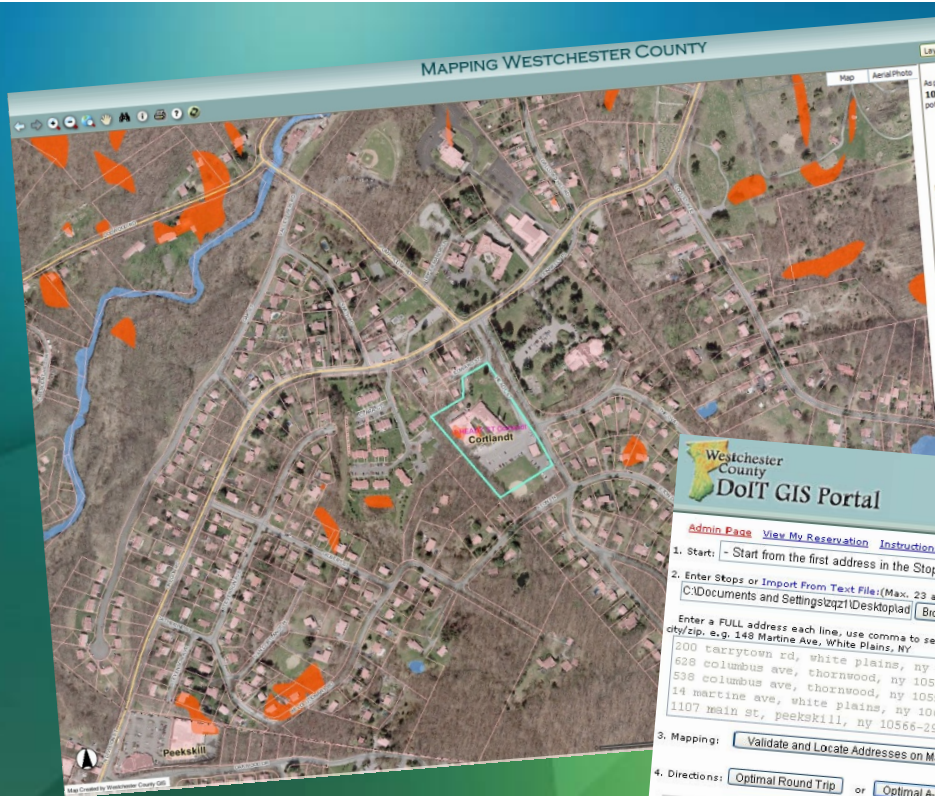
Awards & Accolades

Greener, More Efficient Government

- Implemented energy-saving PC power management software
 - Currently used to power down/power up 4,600+ PCs countywide
 - Saving \$8,000/month in energy costs
- Implemented a route optimization tool for County fleet vehicles
 - Uses GIS to reduce vehicle maintenance costs and the County's carbon footprint
- Developed a Solar Power Property Finder
 - Uses GIS to locates properties that may be good candidates for solar power
- Westchester Access Program
 - DoIT continues to donate old computers to Westchester not-for-profit organizations, reducing the amount of electronic waste in the county

Greener, More Efficient Government (cont'd)

- Continue countywide analysis of cell phone, Blackberry, personal printer, fax & pager usage
- Recycling at County Records Center
 - By using the County's shredder, DoIT added 26 tons to the county total for paper recycling in 2009
 - Insert latest numbers / savings (\$\$) here
- Reevaluation of maintenance contracts
 - Led to significant cost savings of over \$500,000
- Implemented a system which allows employees to be paid for their business-related travel & meals through EFT (Electronic Funds Transfer)
 - A similar system was launched which allows County-generated bail checks to be paid through EFT.
- Server Virtualization
 - Replacing traditional servers with fewer, more energy-efficient "virtual" servers
 - Cost avoidance of \$750,000

Smart & Secure Infrastructure



- Migrated 63 County locations to Metro Ethernet Service
 - Reducing network maintenance costs
 - Improving network speed, redundancy & bandwidth
 - Lays the groundwork for future expansion & supports the latest technologies
- Built and configured a resilient e-mail infrastructure
 - Allows e-mail access even in case of whole site/building failure
 - Migrated 7,300 +user and service mailboxes to the new system
- Developed procedures for Litigation Hold and Legal eDiscovery

 - Serves 132 municipal sites (police, fire, schools)
- Domain Name Services (DNS)

- Deployed a fraud detection software solution in DSS
 - Helps identify potential cases of fraud and other opportunities for cost and service efficiency with Medicaid.
- Implemented a Data Exchange & Mental Health Alert System
 - Improves the delivery of mental health services by automatically alerting appropriate staff when a prisoner has a history of mental health issues.
- Implemented an Inmate Medication Dispensing System
 - Delivers medicine with greater efficiency and generates cost savings
- Successfully converted systems which track payments from retirees for their health benefits and civil service data for seasonal employees in local municipalities
- Deployed a Helicopter Video Transmission System for Public Safety
- Implemented Public Health Information Messaging Service (PHINMS) software

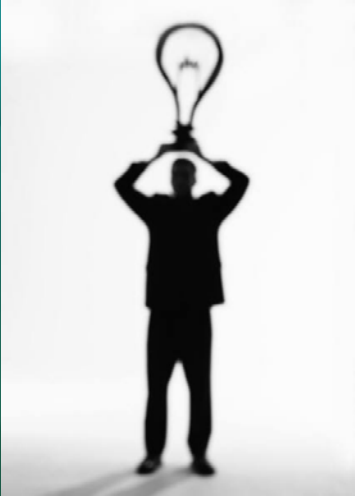

Public Health & Safety

NEW

- System to allow DSS customers to complete their recertification interview independently through the use of a kiosk, web-based application or automated phone system.
- System in the Department of Mental Health to handle case management, billing and clinic management in a completely integrated fashion.
- Cost-saving system for the Department of Correction to support just in time dispensing of medication for inmates.
- Automation of Public Safety's operational briefing information to assist in the rapid dissemination of critical information.
