Dear Honorable Budget Committee Members:

The Office of the Westchester County Clerk is proud to present a lean 2018 budget. The budget once again reduces expenses while maintaining all critical services. The budget presents conservative revenue projections which rely on a level real estate market. Our spending estimates reflect an effort to cut or hold flat spending within our control.

Overall highlights

- Our 2018 revenue is projected at \$9,389,021 while 2018 expenses are projected at \$6,637,297 resulting in a departmental tax levy of -\$2,751,724.
- For the tenth straight year, we have been able to reduce total budgeted expenses, contributing to a 29.5% reduction in budgeted expenses since 2006 (from \$9,243,660 adopted in 2006 down to \$6,637,297 requested for 2018).
- Our staffing remains lean as our overall staffing has been reduced by more than one-third since I took office. One position cut is proposed for 2018.
- Our 2018 budget will provide a high level of service to our customers including the continuation of electronic filing in our Legal Division where approximately eighty-eight percent (88%) of our cases are started electronically, as well as the expansion of electronic recording in our Land Records Division where voluntary participation reached approximately seventy-one (71%) in 2017.

The Office of the Westchester County Clerk will continue to face the financial challenges all governments face head on. We remain committed to improving service while reducing costs to our residents.



2018 Budget

2018 Revenue

Fees paid in connection with the recording of land records such as deeds and mortgages make up the majority (69%) of our revenue. Court and legal fees provide an additional 10% of the revenue collected by our office. New York State reimburses us for expenses in connection with the processing of mortgage tax and this accounts for 10% of our revenue. Passports, permits and other fees join to make up the remaining 11% of our revenue.


2018 Revenue of \$9,389,021



2018 Expenses


Our largest expenses, by far, are our personnel costs which represent 67% of our proposed expenses for 2018 and include salaries, overtime and hourly workers. Interdepartmental charges represent the next largest portion of our expense budget, with 24% of our budget funding items such as our DolT support team, the Archives and the support we receive from the County Attorney. Our general expenses, which make up 7% of our expense budget, include items such as scanning as well as equipment rental. Our materials and supplies budget continues to remain modest as our e-initiatives expand, coming in at 2% of our budget this year. Additional and replacement equipment continue to make up less than 1% of our budgeted expenses.

Annual Budget vs. Budget Adjusted for Consumer Price Index (CPI)



The average number of days before a land record submitted to the Office of the Westchester County Clerk is recorded. If submissions are made before noon, they are often recorded before noon on the following business day. Electronic submissions made through our Property Records Electronic Portal (PREP) System can be on record in a matter of hours.

The approximate number of newly naturalized citizens who will have been sworn in by the Westchester County Clerk in 2017. Naturalization ceremonies take place approximately every other Wednesday in the Richard J. Daronco Courthouse.

The approximate percentage of electronically submitted land records, facilitated by the County Board's capital funding in 2008. The success of this voluntary program is paying huge dividends in the form of faster recording times, increased efficiency, and cost-savings.






Foreclosure Filings and Judgments



Tax Certiorari Proceedings Commenced




Small Claims Assessment Review Petitions Filed
