Anthony Amiano was born in Mount Vernon to Anthony and Monica Amiano and was raised in Valhalla, with his sister, Amanda. Anthony graduated from Valhalla High School and earned a Bachelor's degree from Manhattan College as well as a Master's degree from Columbia University.

From an early age, Anthony believed in the importance of serving his community. To this end, he sought and won election to the Valhalla School District Board of Education in 2014, and later as a Councilman on the Mount Pleasant Town Board, serving in both instances as one of the youngest elected officials in New York State. In addition, he made

time to volunteer on various local boards and committees, including the Westchester County Parks, Recreation and Conservation Board and the Mount Pleasant Architectural Review Board, and is also a faithful parishioner and volunteer at Holy Name of Jesus Church in Valhalla.
