New Initiatives & Highlights

- **Playland** visitors exceeded half-million in 2019, highest in four years. Additional marketing funding of \$250,000 will help continue this trend in 2020.
- Curators Three new Curator positions added for coverage of Nature Centers and to assist with all Conservation initiatives.
- Westchester County Center Introduced a new sound and lighting package to the public and promoters with great success expected to continue in 2020.
- **Golf** reconstruction and reopening of Maple Moor and parks management of Hudson Hills has allowed for a better player experience and additional rounds.
- **Sprain Ridge Pool** Activity and Competition pools opened in 2019. In June the entire facility will be open including new diving boards and area.
- Miller House Grand reopening of restored historic house in fall, regular programming in 2020.
- Merestead Restoration of the Main House exterior will be underway during the year.
- North County Trailway Reconstruction is underway, reopening expected fall 2020.
- **Bronx River Pathway** Construction is underway to link the section between Scarsdale and Hartsdale, with projected opening in fall 2020.
- George's Island Park Capital improvement project nearing completion, reopening spring 2020.
- Volunteer Programs Numerous projects continue in partnership with Westchester Parks Foundation.
