New Initiatives & Highlights

- Activated and staffed the EOC and Emergency Support Services Warehouse from March 2nd through July 17th in response and recovery to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Procured, managed and distributed personal protective equipment to first responders, healthcare providers, local municipalities, non-profit organizations, disability service providers and small businesses to assist with response and recovery to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Provided equipment to support the decontamination of EMS units that were used for the COVID-19 response, including the FEMA National Ambulance Contract that was utilized to support patient care
- Procured new Push-to-Talk LTE devices on the FirstNet network to support local response coordination, including the potential use for alternative care sites if required
- Worked with Con Edison to develop a new training prop and curriculum that simulates over 30 different types of gas emergencies that firefighters may encounter
