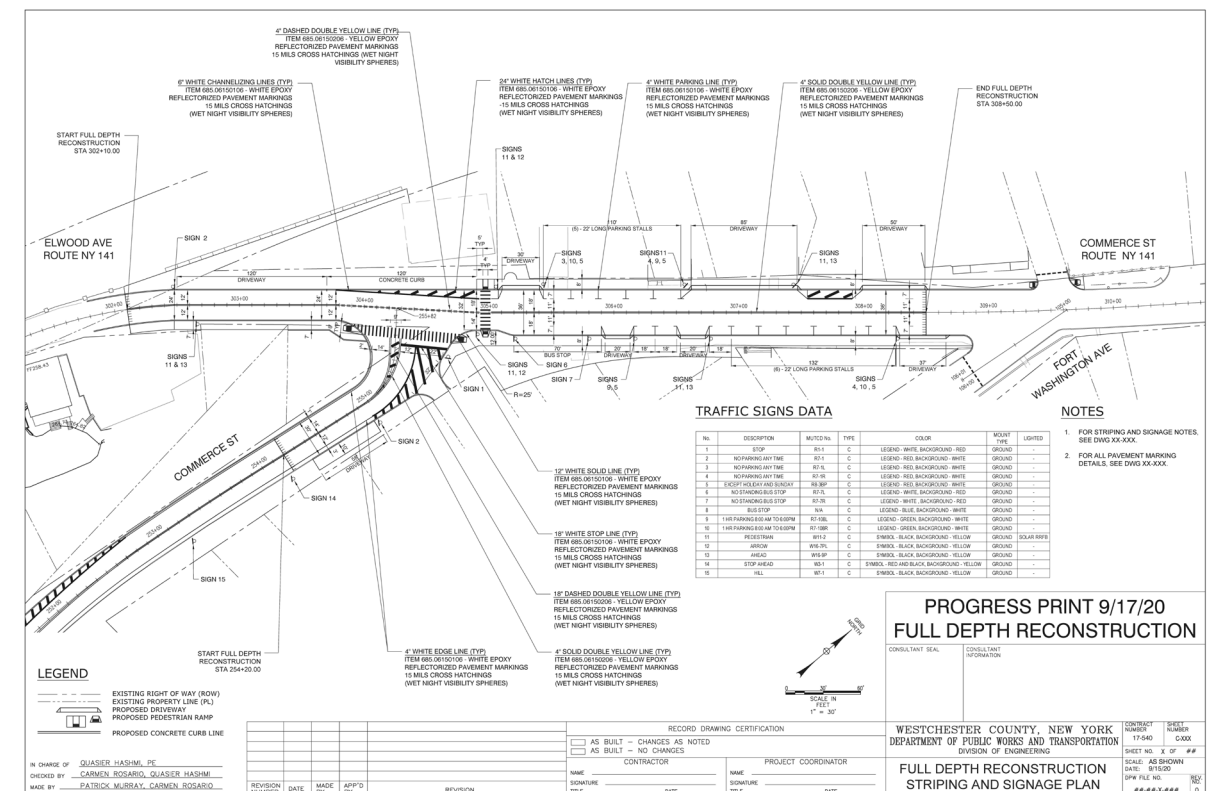
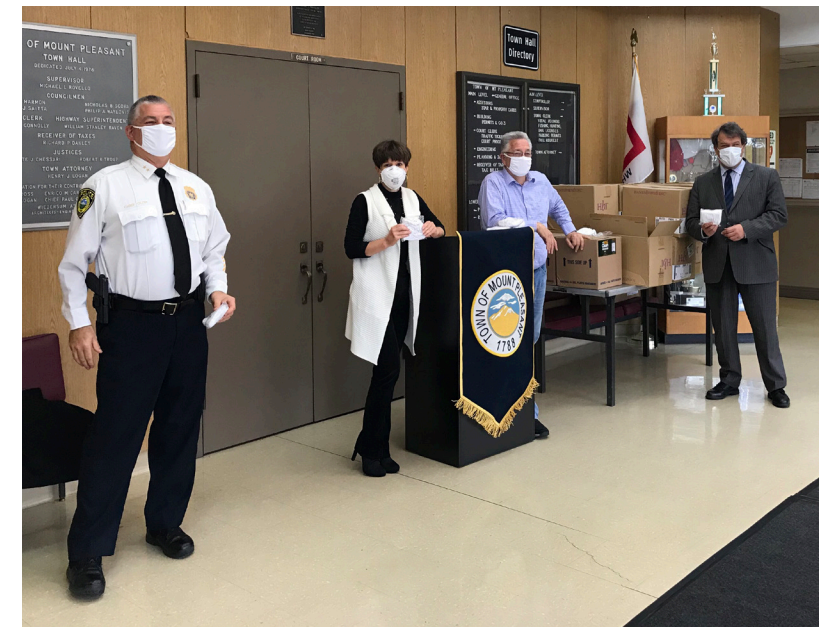
Commerce Street Reconfiguration Project Moves to Construction Phase

In June, the Westchester County Board of Legislators unanimously passed a bond act to finance the construction of a critical infrastructure project to reconfigure a precarious section of Commerce Street at the intersection of Elwood Avenue in Hawthorne. This particular section of Commerce Street has been the site of numerous vehicular accidents over the years, including a pedestrian fatality in February 2013. The additional funding was added to the County's 2020 capital projects budget at the urging of County Legislator Margaret Cunzio.

"I am pleased that my colleagues joined me in a bipartisan fashion to make the necessary improvements to the Commerce Street and Elwood Avenue intersection," said Legislator Cunzio, who is serving her third term on the Board of Legislators. "This comprehensive reconfiguration will address the issues and concerns that have plagued this intersection for decades. Most importantly, the project will overhaul the current design of the roadway to prioritize public safety. I look forward to seeing it come to fruition."

The bond act will also fund the rehabilitation of the roadway from West Stevens Avenue to Liberty Street, including resurfacing, curb replacement, drainage improvements, the installation of ramps compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act, and new traffic loops.

Overall construction is expected to take approximately 18 months after the awarding and execution of contracts. With the design now complete, the construction phase is expected to begin later this year. ■
