Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As the pandemic era has stretched into 2021, my most important job as your County Legislator continues to be to spread the most current information from all levels of government, constantly being in the community, and gathering information from the field to report back to all relevant departments. Beyond that, I have been literally on the front lines of aiding those most in need with food insecurity, housing and "digital divide" issues. This has not stopped us from the underlying and ongoing business of the County Government, actually reducing the County property tax levy for three consecutive years and prudently investing in the future of our infrastructure and of our people.

Our Board of Legislators has accelerated work to improve County roads (including upper Main Street/Winter Hill in Tuckahoe and the Bronx River Parkway running north from Cross County), bridges, wastewater recovery facilities and

the beautiful parklands that have been a refuge to many during these trying times. We have continued our ongoing programs to replace our diesel buses with electric and hybrid models, increase the number of electric charging stations in Countycontrolled parking lots, place solar panels on as many of our buildings as we can, and ramp up centralized recycling and composting programs. We also find it critically important to improve our human infrastructure, notably by steadily increasing support for daycare families, facilitating parents' return to gainful employment and better preparing children for success in school and beyond.

An independent study commissioned by the County tells us that we need more than 11,000 new units of housing to meet the demand of those who wish to live and work here. We continue the work of incentivizing private developers, mainly by floating millions of dollars of long-term, low-interest bonds, to create a mix

of units that are attainable by regional workforce, local seniors and our less economically advantaged neighbors, along with units at market prices. We also passed a new law which will make sales of **co-op apartments** — often the first rung in the ladder to accumulated family wealth — more transparent and much simpler.

As a member of the County Police Reform & Reimagining Task Force, I pushed especially hard for **Mental Health Response Units**, modeled on those that have succeeded in several other jurisdictions. These units answer emergency calls with a personal crisis intervention team that is trained and equipped to de-escalate specific situations, and can direct residents to the help they need. This model allows the police to focus on the work they have been trained for.
