SUMMARY OF NEW VOTING LAWS

NEW LAW	WHAT IT MEANS	EFFECTIVE DATE
One Primary Election Date	This law establishes a unified primary date, the fourth	Immediately.
A single Primary Election date means there will no longer be a September Primary Election date	<u>Tuesday in June</u> , which applies to all candidates for public office (Federal, State, County and Local). Village Elections will remain on the <u>third Tuesday of</u> <u>March</u> every year.	The 2019 Primary Date is Tuesday, June 25 th .
Voter Change of Address	This law ensures that when a voter moves elsewhere	March 25, 2019
<i>Voters will no longer have to re-register in person when they move</i>	within New York State, and the Board of Elections receives notice of an address change from the U.S. Post Office, a State Agency or an affidavit ballot, their voter registration will seamlessly go with them.	
Pre-registration for Minors	This law allows 16 and 17-year-olds to pre-register to	January 1, 2020
Relates to voter pre- registration	vote and enables them to then be automatically registered and eligible to vote on their 18th birthday.	
Early Voting Will allow registered voters in New York the option to vote early	This law creates a 10-day 'early voting' period, for both Primary and General Elections (<i>see NOTE</i>), making voting more convenient for everyone including those whose professional or family situations make it difficult to physically get to the polls on Election Day. It will also reduce waiting times at the polls.	Although this new law is effective immediately, the first opportunity for early voting will take place before the General Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2019

In 2019, the dates for Early Voting will be <u>Saturday</u> , <u>October 26th through (and including) Sunday</u> , <u>November 3rd</u> .	The Westchester County Board of Elections will select multiple voting locations <u>specifically for Early Voting</u> (which may not be a regular polling place). At least seven locations for early voting are required under State law. The Westchester County Board of Elections will notify you by mail of your Early Voting polling place.	Early Voting for the Primary Election in June

In addition, there are two more laws that have been approved for Constitutional Amendments; this means they must pass two consecutive State Legislatures and a public referendum before these laws can become effective.

Same-Day Registration Currently, voter registration must take place at least 25 days before Primary and General Elections	This bill, if enacted, would allow same-day voter registration.	(No earlier than 2021)
Absentee voting by mail** Currently, a voter may only vote by mail (via an absentee ballot) if they will knowingly be out of town or ill on Election Day	This bill, if enacted, would remove the current restrictions and allow all voters the option of voting by mail for any reason.	(No earlier than 2021)

** There is <u>no change</u> in the absentee voting by mail process in 2019 or 2020

- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Must be registered to vote in the County of Westchester
- Hours are from 5:30 a.m. 9:30 p.m.

Election inspectors are always needed

We are always looking for individuals to work as election inspectors. Election inspectors receive \$225 for working on Election Day, plus \$25 to attend each training class. To qualify you must:

- Be a registered voter
- Be a resident of Westchester County
- Attend two training classes
